

Originally built in 1927, this 17-story building (the tallest in the Gramercy Park area) was originally the Salvation Army's Residence for women and later became the School of Visual Art's facility before being sold to the Zeckendorf Group in 2012, who decided to convert its space into condominium apartments designed by Robert A.M. Stern Architects. The project consisted of approximately 450 m² of 2 cm Calacatta Caldia® marble, both polished and honed, for the entire area of its bathrooms (floors, walls, shower and vanity tops) in all the 13 units of the building.
