The Foster and Partner-designed 100 East 53rd Street in Midtown Manhattan is a new glass tower that adjoins a 9-story base, soaring 216 m² into the Midtown skyline. Located on the corner between Lexington Avenue and 53rd Street, it replaces the old YWCA building and is adjacent to architectural icons such as the Seagram Building and Lever House.

In the spirit of Mies's philosophy of rationality, simplicity and clarity, 100E53 elevates the definition of luxury, offering refined, modern residences and several amenities. The entry sequence reveals a gallery-like lobby with waved fluted walls in Statuario Caldia® marble, fabricated by the MGI Group for a real dynamic feeling.
